Tomorrow's preview is from 12noon to 2pm upstairs at Dixey C B Opticians in West Street.

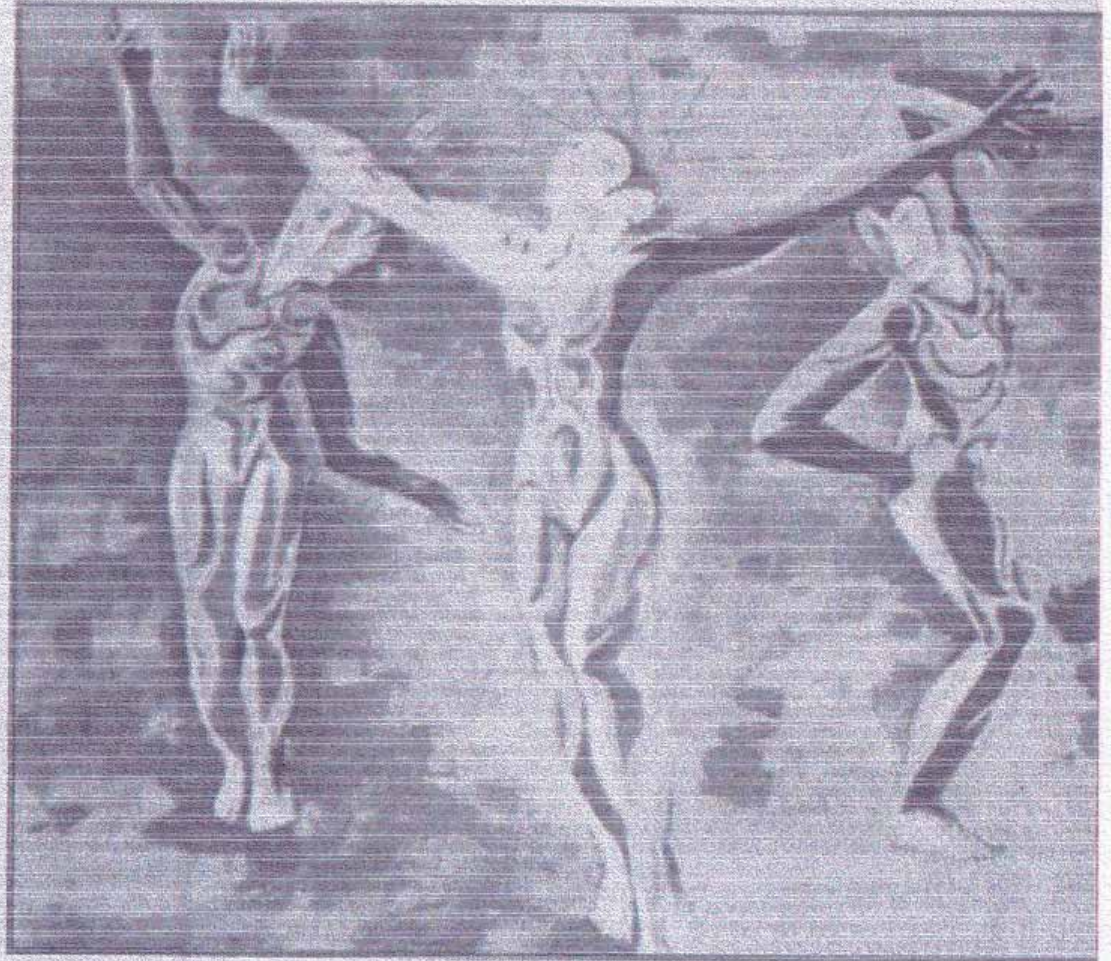
The exhibition, which is free, is from 9am to 5.30pm, Monday until Saturday, February 5.
