These included an art and design foundation course at Northbrook College, a BA in Sculpture at the Winchester School of Arts and an MA in Sculpture at the Royal Academy School.

Paul said, 'I have always liked drawing and making things but I think it was David who really encouraged me and supported me.'

Because of the three's shared interest it was decided that they should exhibit their work as a group.

This led to the exhibition, called Sweet, being held at the Crypt Gallery, which proved popular among visitors.

Paul said, 'We came up with the idea for the show because

we're all interested in domestic things and natural and sweet colours.

'We came up with the idea that instead of using suite, (three-piece suite) we would change the name into sweet.'

'Even though we were talking about similar ideas it worked very well because we used different mediums to discuss that.'

The artist is now juggling his exhibition work with teaching 3D design and a sculpture course at Northbrook College.
